

Global Burden of Vulvar Cancer: GLOBOCAN 2020 Analysis

International Journal of Cancer (2023). This important study presents the first global estimates of vulvar cancer incidence and mortality based on GLOBOCAN 2020 data. With over 45,000 new cases and 17,000 deaths annually, the highest burden falls on Southern and Eastern Africa and some Pacific regions. The findings highlight significant disparities in access to care, calling for strengthened prevention, early diagnosis, and treatment efforts—particularly in low-resource settings.


Management of Patients with Vulvar Cancer: A Comparison of International Guidelines

This comprehensive review analyses the main European and American guidelines for managing vulvar cancer, highlighting significant variations in diagnostic and therapeutic approaches. The study emphasizes the necessity of a multidisciplinary treatment strategy and calls for updates to align guidelines with the latest scientific evidence—aiming to standardize care and improve patient outcomes.
