





As 2025 draws to a close, PSRH reflects with deep gratitude on a year marked by collaboration, resilience, and the continued commitment of our Pacific reproductive health community.

Across our programmes — PEMNeT, Gynae Oncology, Family Planning, Midwifery Leadership, and MPDSR — this has been a year of strengthening foundations and preparing for the next phase of growth. While travel and funding timelines meant that some in-person workshops were deferred, coordination and planning have continued at country level, ensuring readiness for renewed activity in 2026. The PEMNeT team, in particular, has remained active in mentoring coordinators and refining training systems that will support wider implementation next year.











A significant milestone was the renewal and upgrade of the PSRH website, improving access, usability, and visibility for members across the region. The site now provides easier navigation, updated content, and a more responsive Members' Lounge — reflecting PSRH's ongoing investment in connection and communication.

Throughout the year, PSRH's monthly webinars continued to offer valuable opportunities for shared learning. Topics ranged from clinical updates on preterm feeding and vulvar cancer to sessions on midwifery leadership, genderbased violence, and respectful care. Each webinar represented the generosity of our presenters, facilitators, and participants who freely shared knowledge to strengthen the Pacific health workforce.

Behind every PSRH activity lies the altruism, professionalism, and shared sense of duty of members and volunteers who give their time, skills, and energy in service to our Pacific community. Their contributions — whether delivering training, developing materials, or mentoring colleagues — demonstrate that progress in our region is sustained not only by funding but by commitment and compassion.
