16TH PSRH BIENNIAL SCIENTIFIC CONFERENCE UPDATE



14–18 September 2026, Nuku'alofa, Tonga

Preparations for the scientific programme of the 16th PSRH Conference in Tonga continue to progress, with strong engagement from regional and international speakers, researchers, clinicians, educators and development partners.

Guided by the conference theme: “Fakakaukau ki he kaha’u – Building and sustaining the Pacific SRH workforce through strengthened regional collaboration” the three-day scientific meeting will explore many of the challenges, innovations and opportunities shaping reproductive health care across the Pacific region.

Delegates can expect a dynamic programme featuring:

- Pacific-led keynote discussions
- Workforce and systems-focused panel sessions
- Research and abstract presentations
- Clinical updates and case discussions
- Education and simulation initiatives
- Leadership and policy conversations
- Quality improvement and service redesign experiences from across the region

The Opening Ceremony will feature insights from both regional and international leaders. This year’s conference has seen a surge in interest from abstract presenters across the Pacific, highlighting a strong regional commitment to research, workforce development, innovation, and Pacific-led solutions for reproductive health. Ultrasound Scanning Workshop Spotlight

Ultrasound Skills Training Supported Through International Collaboration

The Ultrasound Workshop will provide participants with an opportunity to strengthen practical ultrasound skills through small-group teaching, simulation activities and guided hands-on learning.

Supported through collaboration with international partners and faculty, the workshop will incorporate specialised educational resources, loaned simulation equipment and training modules designed to support learning in resource-variable clinical settings. The programme aims to strengthen participant confidence, practical application and peer learning, while also creating valuable opportunities for Pacific clinicians to build professional relationships and networks with colleagues and faculty from across the region and internationally.

Introducing the PSRH Midwifery Breakfast Masterclass



For the first time, PSRH will introduce a dedicated Midwifery Breakfast Masterclass during the 2026 Conference in Tonga. Designed as a relaxed and collegial networking session, the Breakfast Masterclass will bring together midwives from across the Pacific to share experiences and discuss regional priorities, leadership, workforce development and country-led initiatives. The session has been intentionally scheduled to allow participants to also engage in specialised workshops and multidisciplinary learning opportunities offered throughout the conference. With colleagues from across the region gathered together in Tonga, PSRH hopes the Masterclass will help foster practical planning, ongoing dialogue and stronger midwifery collaboration during the meeting and beyond.
