Profile

Dr Nanise Sikiti, Gynae Oncologist

Can you briefly describe your career journey and your current role?

I was born and raised in Levuka, Ovalau. After primary and secondary education in Levuka, I attended the University of the South Pacific for Foundation Science. I graduated from the Fiji

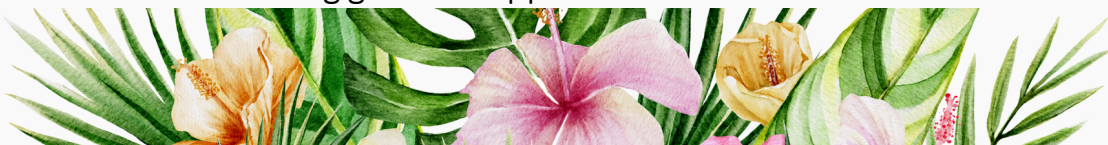
School of Medicine with a Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery. My internship was at Labasa Hospital, followed by two years at Tukavesi Health Centre. I then spent eight years at Colonial War Memorial Hospital, earning a postgraduate diploma and master's in OBGYN. In 2015, I received an award from the Asia Oceania Federation of Obstetrics and Gynaecology and presented my master's thesis in Malaysia and Vancouver. In 2019, I joined the global training fellowship in gynae oncology through the International Gynaecology and Cancer Society, completing it in 2022. Currently, I work at Lautoka Health Care Fiji as a consultant gynae oncology specialist.

What inspired you to join the PSRH board?

I joined the board to make a difference in the healthcare of Pacific women, particularly in gynae cancers. I aim to address challenges, improve outcomes, and contribute to preventative cervical cancer programs through PSRH. Additionally, I value networking among the Pacific Islands to support healthcare with my gynae oncology expertise.

What have been your main contributions so far?

This is my third year on the board. My contributions include oncology expertise, serving as board secretary, and linking PSRH to the global oncology community. I ensure the IGCS tumor board runs smoothly and am helping to establish the oncology subcommittee, linking it to the board and setting goals to support Pacific Island countries.

Pacific Island Cervical Cancer Screening Initiative

The Pacific Island Cervical Cancer Screening Initiative (PICCSI) aims to eradicate cervical cancer in the Pacific Islands by screening women for Human Papillomavirus (HPV), the virus that causes cervical cancer. Similar to methods used in Australia and New Zealand, PICCSI employs on-the-spot PCR testing to detect HPV within one hour. Women who test positive are offered immediate treatment to prevent the progression of cervical cancer. This same-day approach reduces the number of women lost to follow-up and lowers long-term cancer rates. Since its inception in Fiji in 2018, PICCSI has planned expansions across the Pacific, contingent on funding. PICCSI, a non-profit organisation, relies on self-funded volunteers from Australia and collaborates closely with local healthcare teams to provide services, health education, and advocacy. The initiative also collects critical data on HPV prevalence, educates local healthcare workers, and ensures cultural, social, and environmental responsibility by leveraging the expertise of the Melbourne-based Australian Centre for the Prevention of Cervical Cancer (ACPCC). Dr Nanise Sikiti, Gynae Oncologist Profile Continued:

What challenges have you faced in your career, and how did you handle them?

Challenges include patient education, language barriers, HR issues, and facility limitations. As a gynae oncologist, my biggest challenge is treating patients who present at late stages due to low screening coverage. I hope to train more local gynae oncologists and strengthen our network to better address these challenges.

What do you hope to see in the future of reproductive health in the Pacific?

I hope all Pacific Island women have good access to healthcare, with cervical cancer screening coverage exceeding 70% as per WHO targets. I envision increased health education, awareness, empowerment, specialized cancer centres, and trained local professionals to ensure no Pacific woman dies from cervical cancer.

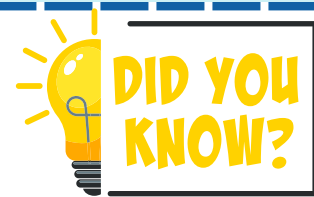
